

### **CAP** reform proposals – European Parliament

- May 2019: European Parliament Elections
- ▶ 4 September 2019: COMAGRI decision to resume work on CAP proposals and submit reports to Plenary.
- Mid-September 2019: rapporteurs confirmed
  - SPR Jahr (EPP/DE)
  - HZR Mueller (RE/DE)
  - CMO Andrieu (S&D/FR)
- ➤ **5 December 2019**: COMAGRI approved a list of points/articles to be re-opened. Objective: political groups to table amendments directly to Plenary for adoption by June 2020 (no vote in COMAGRI). List of points not yet approved / validated by COMENVI.

Opened articles include: articles in shared competence with COMENVI (related to Env/Climate) + articles with COMAGRI exclusive competence (e.g. direct payments outside Env/Climate) + Commission

# CAP reform proposals – European Parliament COMAGRI report (April 2019) key points

#### Rural Development:

- Additional types of intervention ("women in rural areas" and "installation of digital technologies")
- Incentive element for management commitments and ANC
- Overly detailed specifications of the types of interventions
- Voluntary character of risk management
- Including ANC (max. 40%) in the 30% EAFRD ring fencing for environment and climate
- CAP strategic plans starting only in 2022

Several RD articles proposed to be re-opened (mostly in shared competence with ENVI)



# CAP reform proposals – European Parliament COMAGRI report (April 2019) key issues

#### Direct Payments:

- Mandatory elements kept (e.g. reduction of payments/capping but watered down, genuine farmer, redistributive payment)
- More prescriptions in basic act as for rural development (e.g. definitions, support to young farmers, redistributive payment, small farmers, coupled support)
- Ring-fencing of funds for most types of interventions (e.g. basic income support + redistributive min 60%, eco-schemes min 20%)

#### Conditionality and eco-schemes:

- Conditionality: GAECs/SMRs watered down or become eco-schemes
- Eco-schemes: less flexibility for MS + addition of animal welfare

Articles on definitions (including genuine farmer and permanent grassland), ringfencing, conditionality and eco-schemes re-opened



# CAP reform proposals – European Parliament COMAGRI report (April 2019) key issues

- New Delivery Model CAP Plans, performance clearance and performance review
  - Fear risk of renationalization more EU-based requirements (compliance >< performance)</li>
  - CAP Plans to include in annex "regional intervention programmes"
  - No strict annuality of planning (milestones and financial plan information could be multiannual "where appropriate") and of performance monitoring (performance reports and review meetings)

Certain articles are proposed to be re-opened (notably in relation to green architecture, and approval of CAP Plans)



# CAP reform proposals – European Parliament COMENVI compromise amendments (April 2019) Some key issues

- Reformulation of objectives with stronger stance on environmental ones
- Setting of targets at the level of impact indicators
- Conditionality extended to sectoral types of interventions
- AECMC: only "beneficial for environment" (quid of animal welfare?) and incentive element
- Investments: demonstrate no negative effect on environment; negative list extended
- Ring-fencing EAFRD: 40% for environment (but including ANC)

Most articles related to the environmental ambition and green architecture are being re-opened



### **CAP** reform proposals – Council

- > June 2018: presentation by the Commission of reform package in AGRIFISH
- December 2018: AT Presidency final Progress Report on 3 Regulations
- June 2019: RO Presidency final Progress Report on 3 Regulations
- July 2019: FI Presidency
  - Informal Council (September) Carbon sequestration
  - October Council state of play
  - November Council Higher environmental-climate ambition of the CAP
  - December 2019: Progress Report on 3 Regulations



## Key points under the FI Presidency (1/3)

#### Environmental ambition:

 Suggestion of a ring-fencing of expenditure for climate/environment across pillars, replacing 30% ring-fencing under rural development and mandatory eco-schemes

#### Conditionality / eco-schemes:

- Continued mixed positions on ambition level: some in favor of e.g. limiting conditionality or making eco-schemes voluntary, but other oppose...
- Importance of financial flexibility (in particular under Direct payments for ecoschemes)



## Key points under the FI Presidency (2/3)

- ▶ New Delivery Model CAP plans, Performance clearance and performance review:
  - Intense discussions on reporting (performance clearance (outputs) and performance review (results)), in particular performance clearance for nonarea/animal related interventions (so-called "Option 1").
  - Other points:
    - CAP plan content
    - Frequency of performance review / triggering level of deviation for possible action plans
    - Deadline of annual performance report



## Key points under the FI Presidency (3/3)

#### > Rural Development:

- Possibility to revise LFA definition
- Investments less limitations regarding purchase of land; aid intensities; specifications / extension of exceptions for 100% support rate
- Specific support for the development of small farms added
- Cooperation some precisions regarding LEADER
- Risk management voluntary

#### Direct Payments:

- General trend for turning down proposals for improved targeting; i.e. voluntary reduction of payments/capping, optional application of redistributive payment, no EU definition of genuine farmer and optional implementation
- Fine-tuning of definitions (e.g. eligible hectare)



# Commission - Key points of the Transition Regulations (1/3)

- > Swift agreement on the CAP reform proposals remains the priority
- ➤ Current state of the legislative process makes it impossible to start the CAP Strategic Plans by 1/1/2021
- ➤ Transitional year 2021 to ensure continuity of CAP support based on current rules



## **Key points of the Transition Regulations (2/3)**

# Flexibility Regulation

- Continuity of CAP support in calendar year 2020 (financial year 2021)
- Technical
- Adoption necessary by the end of 2019

# Transitional Regulation

- Continuity of CAP support under both pillars in 2021
- Easing Transition to CAP Plans
- Adoption necessary by summer 2020



## Key points of the Transitional Regulations (3/3)

### > Transitional regulation

- Continuity of CAP support under both pillars in 2021 and under current rules
  - Limited to the transitional year 2021
  - Update of 2021 amounts (Direct Payments, Rural development, sectoral aid programmes, Outermost regions and small Aegean islands)
  - Adaptations of rules to continue support in 2021

- Easing Transition to CAP Plans
  - Sectoral aid programmes: Timeframe adaptations for programmes
  - Carry-over of expenditure from previous programming periods into CAP Strategic Plan
