

Examples of expected achievements

- Knowledge transfer and innovation will be addressed mainly through training and advisory services especially related to resource efficiency, the environment and climate change: nearly 17 000 people will be trained.
- Around 3 % of farms will receive funding for investments focused on innovative potential, young farmers, organic farming, animal welfare and resource efficiency, as well as for land consolidation and agricultural access roads.
- In addition 11 % of farms are expected to participate in animal welfare measures related to summer pasture and improved indoor housing.
- Almost 30 % of farmland will be placed under funded contracts to improve biodiversity, 24 % under contracts for improving water and soil management. Support for environmental investments will complement this contractual support. EUR 29 million is allocated for grassland in Natura 2000 areas.
- The RDP will support investments in more resource efficient wood harvesting and processing technologies. Investments in farm modernisation will also contribute to improve energy or water efficiency or cut Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions. 2.3 % of farmland will be under funded contracts to cut greenhouse gas and ammonia emissions.
- The LEADER approach will cover areas containing 48 % of the rural population. 46 % of the rural population will benefit from new or improved services thanks to fresh investment.

Examples of key challenges

- Nordrhein-Westfalen is the biggest German Land in terms of population. The region is one of the most densely urbanised in Europe. Agriculture has a share of only 0.5 % in the regional gross value added (compared to 1 % in Germany as a whole). Only 0.8 % of the population lives in rural areas. 25 % lives in intermediate areas.
- Demographic change and loss of business activity in rural areas are ongoing challenges.
- In addition, the region faces environmental challenges related to soil erosion, nitrate pollution in surface and ground waters and
 pressure on biodiversity









3. Planned expenditure per priority



Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
