

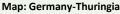

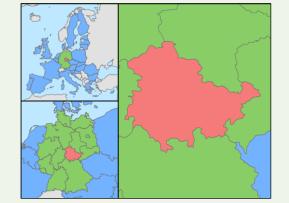

Examples of expected achievements

- Under the cross cutting priority of knowledge transfer and innovation support will be provided for the training of some 7 300 between farmers, foresters and other beneficiaries in rural areas.
- More than 12 % of the farms (roughly 447 holdings) will receive funding for investments with a focus on animal welfare, organic farming resource-efficiency and meeting environmental requirements.
- Support will be granted to around 3.3 % of the agricultural holdings and producers group to participate in quality schemes, local markets and short supply-chains. Priority will be on processing of organic products.
- To address environmental challenges, the RDP aims to bring 18 % of the farmland and nearly 5 % of forest/wooded land under biodiversity contracts. Another 14 % of farmland and 8.5 % of forest land will be under contracts for improving water management.
- With 15 Local Action Groups (LAGs) drawing up Local Development Strategies (LDS), RDP support will provide the 63 % of the rural population with improved services. Around 280 new jobs will be created out of which 150 via LEADER. In addition 15 % of the rural population will benefit from new or improved broadband infrastructure.

Examples of key challenges

- A major environmental challenge in the region relates to the decline of biodiversity. Thuringia is a rural region where agricultural land and forests cover respectively the 56 % and the 34 % of the total area. The almost 3 600 farm holdings and other land-based activities have a major role in environmental management of agricultural and non-agricultural land (mostly forest).
- The regions faces the negative effects of heavy depopulation trends and ageing of society. Population has been declining in the last 15 years and outlooks confirm a drop of 18 % by 2030 with respect to 2010.
- Broadband coverage in rural areas is still lagging behind; 16 Mbit/sec are available in 45 % of Thuringia's households; however, only 12 % of households have 50 Mbit/sec. Thus, access to high-speed internet will be a major challenge.

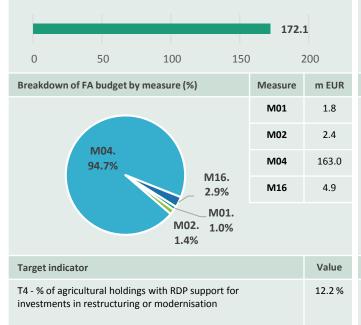

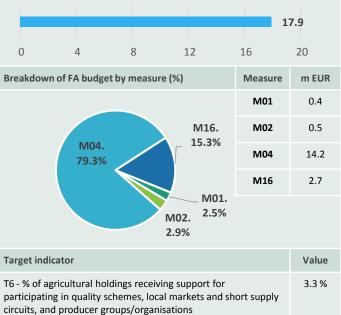
Total public budget (million EUR)

3. Planned expenditure per priority

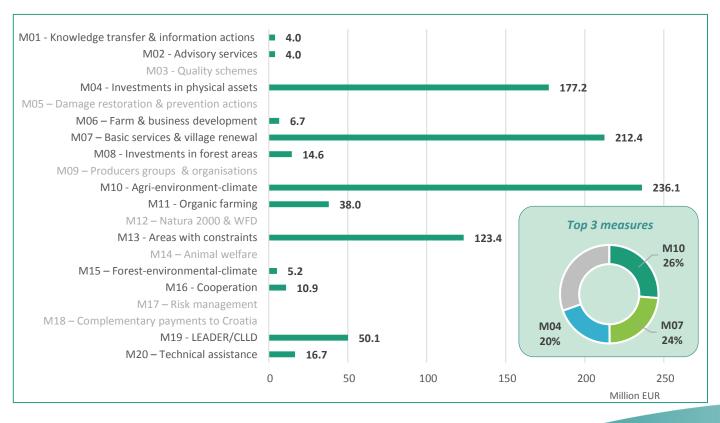

Priority 1 is considered to be cross-cutting and no separate financial allocation is shown as the expenditure is distributed across other focus areas. Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
