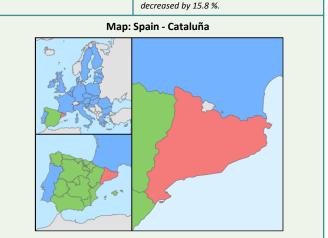

Examples of expected achievements

- Farm investments will support modernization and restructuring of around 6.5 % of all farms (3 950 farmers) in the region.
- · About 3 % of farms (1 800 farmers) will receive support for young farmers to launch their businesses.
- · Around 4 % of farms (2 454 farmers) will receive support to invest in processing and marketing of agricultural products.
- Around 5.2 % of the agricultural land will be under contracts for biodiversity, 6.2 % for water management and 2% for soil
 management. As well, support will be given to convert 8 600 hectares to organic farming and to maintain organic farming on 16 500
 hectares.
- In addition 2.3 % of the region's irrigated area will switch to more efficient irrigation systems.
- Local Development Strategies (LDSs) will improve the living conditions of the rural population and create 600 new jobs as well as new business opportunities. Also, they will cover nearly 39 % of the rural population in Cataluña.

Examples of key challenges

- The key challenges of the region are to establish specific policies for young people in rural areas to promote their economic and social development.
- Another need is to promote economic recovery and job creation, with a focus on the agricultural, food, forestry and rural areas. It
 should stimulate innovation and knowledge transfer in the food sector and promote actions to mitigate and adapt to climate change
 and the protection of natural resources.

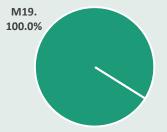

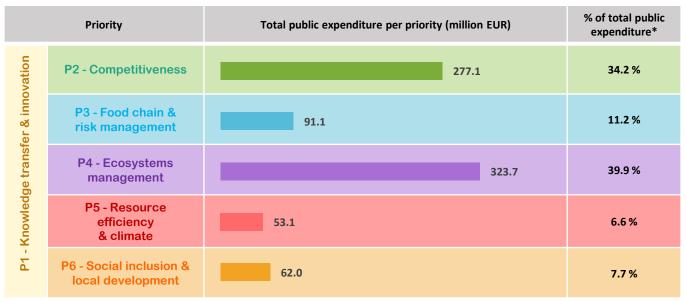

3. Planned expenditure per priority

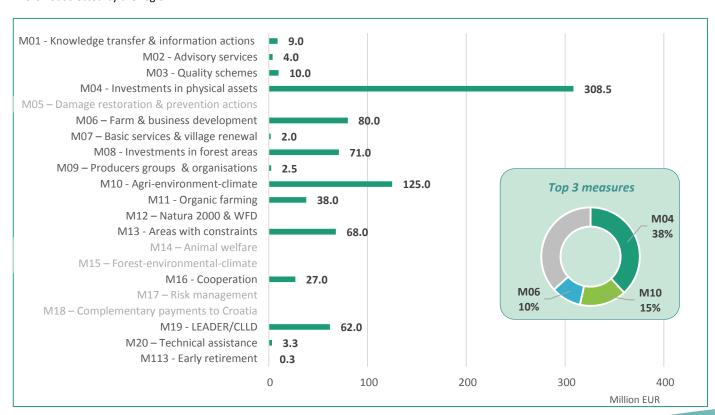
