Examples of expected achievements

- The RDP will support training activities for 75 000 people as well the implementation of 43 cooperation projects. In addition, the programme will enable the installation of 1 800 young farmers in order to support generational renewal in the agricultural sector of the region.
- About 1 300 farmers will be supported to apply quality schemes. Furthermore, 33 producers organizations will be created in order to address the fragmentation of the agri-food industry.
- Around 1 000 projects will be supported to ensure the quality management of forest in Natura 2000 areas. Nearly 15 % of the RDP budget will be devoted to support organic farming, benefiting 287 000 ha.
- The programme will support 135 000 ha of land for the protection of birds.
- In addition, 130 projects will be supported for the improvement of manure storage facilities and the construction of biogas production facilities.
- The RDP will support the modernization of irrigation systems by supporting 500 relevant projects.
- The natural forest area which covers roughly 45 % of the region's territory will receive roughly 30 % of the available budget, notably through measures to prevent forest fires and to reinforce these ecosystems.
- The afforestation of 15 000 ha will contribute to forest conservation and combating climate change.
- The region will support Local Development Strategies (LDS) though 29 Local Action Groups (LAGs) covering 60 % of the rural population. The supported LDS will create around 2 000 new jobs and new business opportunities.

Examples of key challenges

- Generation renewal represents a core challenge for the region, as less than 10 % of the farmers are younger than 40 years old.
- The natural forest area which covers roughly 45% of the region's territory will receive roughly 30% of the available budget, notably through measures to prevent forest fires and to reinforce these ecosystems.
- Water pollution is a challenge as most of the resources are of low quality due to the excessive use of pesticides and fertilizers.















3. Planned expenditure per priority



Priority 1 is considered to be cross-cutting and no separate financial allocation is shown as the expenditure is distributed across other focus areas. Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
