

Examples of expected achievements

- The programme will support the development of innovative solutions through 7 operational groups under the European Innovation Partnership (EIP) and it will make available 1 422 places in training courses targeted the farm sector.
- Farm investments will aim at modernising and restructuring around 3.5 % of all farms in the region, while 2.4 % of farms will receive support for young farmers to launch their businesses.
- The RDP will support 116 projects investing in agricultural holdings as well as processing and marketing of agricultural products.
- Environment/climate-friendly forest investments and area-based payments to farmers for using environment/climate friendly
 management practices, including organic farming, will be supported by the programme. Around 70 % of the forest land will be under
 contracts for biodiversity; 20 % of the agricultural land will be under contracts for biodiversity; 1.9% for water management; and
 19% for soil management.
- Some 3 025 ha of farmland and forest land will be under contracts contributing to fostering carbon conservation and sequestration in agriculture and forestry.
- The region will support 3 LEADER Local Action Groups (LAGs). Their Local Development Strategies will cover nearly 100 % of the rural population which will also create around 180 new jobs.

Examples of key challenges

- Madrid has the largest GDP per capita in the country (about 30% above the EU average.
- Agriculture plays a key role in managing the territory, maintaining the environment and landscapes given that the farming system is mostly extensive. As a result, significant overlap exists between agricultural ecosystems and valuable areas.
- Among the main challenges of the region are the lack of young farmers and the need to increase the size of the holdings. On the environmental side, the main threat is the urban pressure on the environmental values of natural and rural areas.





3. Planned expenditure per priority


