

Examples of expected achievements

- During the programming period Navarra will support 70 cooperation projects and it will create almost 14 000 places in training courses targeted the farm and forestry sectors.
- Farm investments supported will aim at modernising and restructuring 135 farms in the region, while 3.6 % of farms will receive support for young farmers to launch their businesses.
- The region will support the participation in quality schemes, local markets and short supply chain circuits and producer groups or organisations for 60 farmers.
- Most funds under the RDP Priority 4 will be used for area-based payments to farmers for using environment/climate friendly management practices, including organic farming (8 000 ha in maintenance and 500 ha in conversion), as well as support for environment/climate friendly forest investments. More than 17 % of the agricultural land will be under contract for biodiversity and a bit less than 4 % for water and soil management.
- The RDP will address investments related to efficiency in energy use in agriculture and food processing (EUR 153.5 million investment (public + private)). Bioeconomy will also be well supported. Regarding water efficiency, 2 % of the region's irrigated area will switch to more efficient irrigation systems.
- The programme will support 4 LEADER Local Action Groups (LAG) and their Local Development Strategies will create new business opportunities and 90 new jobs. Another 100 jobs will be created through investments on non-agricultural activities and in forest products and technologies.

Examples of key challenges

- The region is challenged by the need to bring more competitiveness to the agro food sector and holdings, especially in terms of size, efficiency or quality of products.
- Another challenge is the lack of young farmers in the primary sector.
- Sustainability of rural activities as well as nature protection should be enhanced in the region.
- Supporting the population in rural areas, and specifically in less favoured ones, would also need to be addressed.






