Examples of expected achievements

- Knowledge transfer and innovation will be addressed mainly through measures supporting training of more than 9 000 participants. In addition, 30 cooperation projects will be supported.
- Farm investments aimed at modernising and restructuring the sector will be supported in around 744 farms in the region, while an additional 640 farms will receive support for young farmers to launch their businesses.
- · The RDP will support 650 projects investing in agricultural holdings as well as processing and marketing of agricultural products.
- Around 22 500 ha of farmland and 25 % of forestry will come under management contracts to improve biodiversity. This also
 includes supporting the conversion or maintenance of organic farming on nearly 15 000 hectares. As well, around 22 500 ha of
 farmland and forest land will be under contracts contributing to fostering carbon conservation and sequestration in agriculture and
 forestry.
- Nearly 46% of the rural population will be affected by the Local Development Strategies (LDS), which will also create around 150 new jobs.

Examples of key challenges

- Agriculture plays a key role in maintaining the environment and landscapes as well as in supporting the export-oriented agri-food sector of the region. A key challenge is to enhance the dimension of the 120 000 agricultural holdings (average size7.5 hectares) which is due to a lack of know-how and part-time farming and limitations in investment capacity.
- Other challenges of the region are the low level of generation renewal in the primary sector, the risk of abandonment of farmland and the fragmentation of holdings. The region also faces high unemployment rates among the youth (more than 50% rate).
- On the environmental side, the region faces problems of vulnerability to climate change (risk of flood, drought, fire), water scarcity
 and soil and forest deterioration.



3. Planned expenditure per priority


