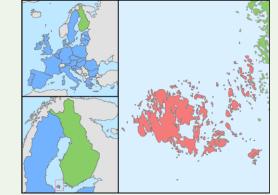

Examples of expected achievements

- Improving competitiveness and structure of the agricultural sector while taking into account environmental concerns: supporting investments on almost 14 % of farms, supporting the establishment of young farmers in the 4 % of farms and training 150 people.
- Reducing the harmful environmental impacts of farming regarding surface water, soil and air, by promoting the use of environmentally/climate friendly farming practices and cultivation techniques: about 72 % of agricultural land is expected to come under agri-environment-climate measures.
- Improving service innovations: around 7 000 people, a quarter of the islands' population, will benefit from improved services.
- Promoting food chain organisation, including processing and marketing of agricultural products, animal welfare and risk management in agriculture, as well as supporting a better incorporation of farmers into the food chain.
- Foster innovation by offering advisory services and investment support and by facilitating the transfer of knowledge.

Examples of key challenges

- Åland is an archipelago of 6 700 islands of which 60 are inhabited with a population of around 29 000 people.
- The total surface area of the archipelago is 13 324 km², of which the 88 % is lakes and ponds. Of the area which is land, most is forest (43 % or 67 000 ha). As a consequence farmland is relatively unimportant, being on 9 % of the land area (14 000 ha).
- Together with the archipelagic conditions the cold climate and the thin, infertile soils contribute to the low agriculture profitability.
- The negative environmental impacts of farming include the eutrophication of ponds and lakes, the deterioration of natural habitats and the reduction of wildlife species.
- The average farm size is 25.9 ha. The share of farmers older than 50 years is around 20 %. The number of farms has been decreasing in recent years. In 2013 there were 470 farms, of which 63 % were crop farms and 37 % livestock farms. 23 % of the arable land is under organic production.

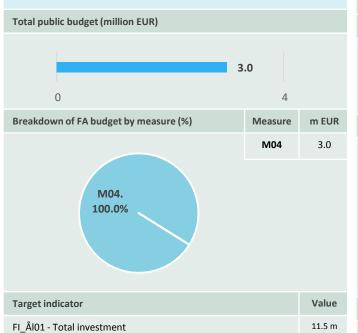

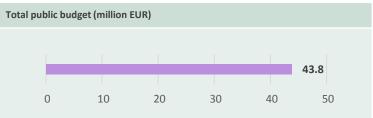

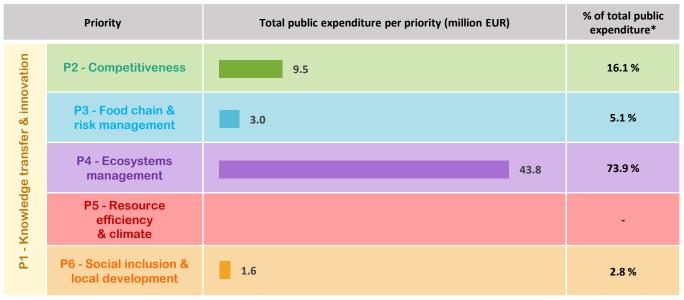

3. Planned expenditure per priority

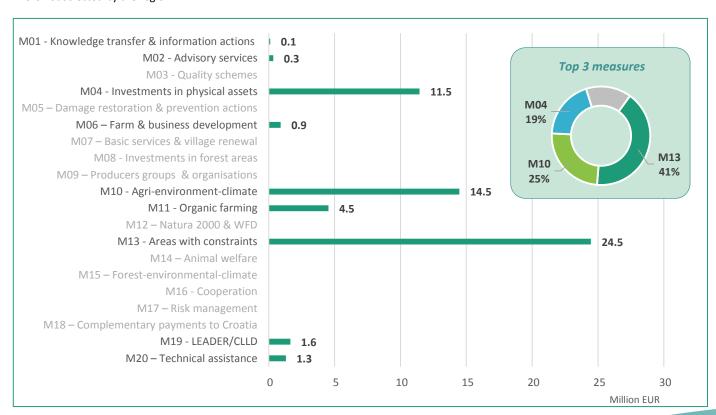
