

Examples of expected achievements

- · Aiming to promote lifelong learning the RDP for Auvergne will provide training to 10 000 participants.
- Moreover, to foster knowledge transfer it will support 60 cooperation projects including projects under the European Innovation Partnership on Agricultural Productivity and Sustainability.
- The programme intends to support modernization and development projects in 19 % of the region's farms. Similarly, it intends to support generational renewal by setting a target of 2 800 projects to install young farmers throughout the programming period.
- To improve the competitiveness of producers it is expected to support 450 system quality certification schemes for agricultural products and foodstuffs.
- About 9 % of the agricultural area will be covered by agri-environment contracts and 300 non-productive investments projects will be linked to the achievement of agri-environmental objectives.
- The RDP Auvergne will also focus on LEADER projects as a tool for local development aiming to create 150 jobs through Local Development Strategies (LDS).

Examples of key challenges

- The agricultural activity in the region accounts for 5 % of jobs and is characterized by low agricultural income levels (22 000 EUR / AWU or 7 000 EUR below the national average).
- Another feature of the region's agriculture is the declining and aging population of active farmers (the share of those less than 40 years old decreased from 29 % in 2000 to 20 % in 2010).
- The region also suffers from a significant risk of land abandonment in mountain areas (7 out of 10 farms are located in mountain areas) which would have negative effects on the environment and employment in rural areas.
- An equally important issue is to support initiatives favourable to the economic development in rural areas and to guarantee a minimum of services to the population in remote areas.








