Examples of expected achievements

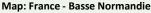
- Around 5 % of the region's agricultural area will be under agri-environment-climate contracts as to ensure the preservation of the
 natural resources. Changes in agricultural practices will also be accompanied by around 270 non-productive investments projects
 linked to the achievement of agro-environmental objectives.
- The programme will support around 70 projects on studies and investments associated with maintenance, restoration and rehabilitation of High Nature Value areas, including Natura 2000 network sites (about 8 % of Lower Normandy territory).
- The programme will support 2 600 farms (11 % of the total) on projects for modernization and development.
- The RDP for Lower Normandy plans to support generational renewal by financing 1 800 projects on young farmers.
- About 700 investment projects are planned for supporting the acquisition of innovative equipment for improved energy efficiency on farms and agro-food industries.
- About 13 % of programme's resources will be used for improving the living conditions in rural areas aiming to provide 17 % of the rural population with improved services and infrastructure.
- 23 Local Development Strategies (LDS) will be implemented by Local Action Groups (LAGs), benefiting 68 % of the rural population.

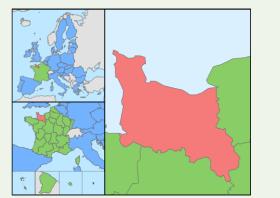
Examples of key challenges

- Lower Normandy is the second region in France by weight of employment in rural areas (52 % of total employment).
- The strong rurality of the region makes it necessary to consolidate villages and small towns by providing services that will allow improving and sustaining living conditions in rural areas.

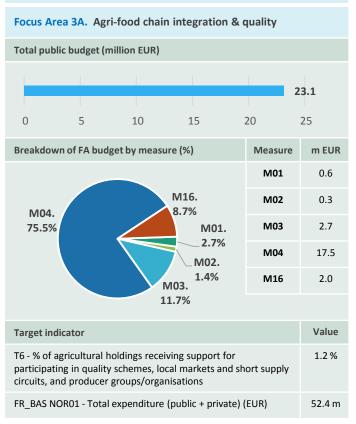

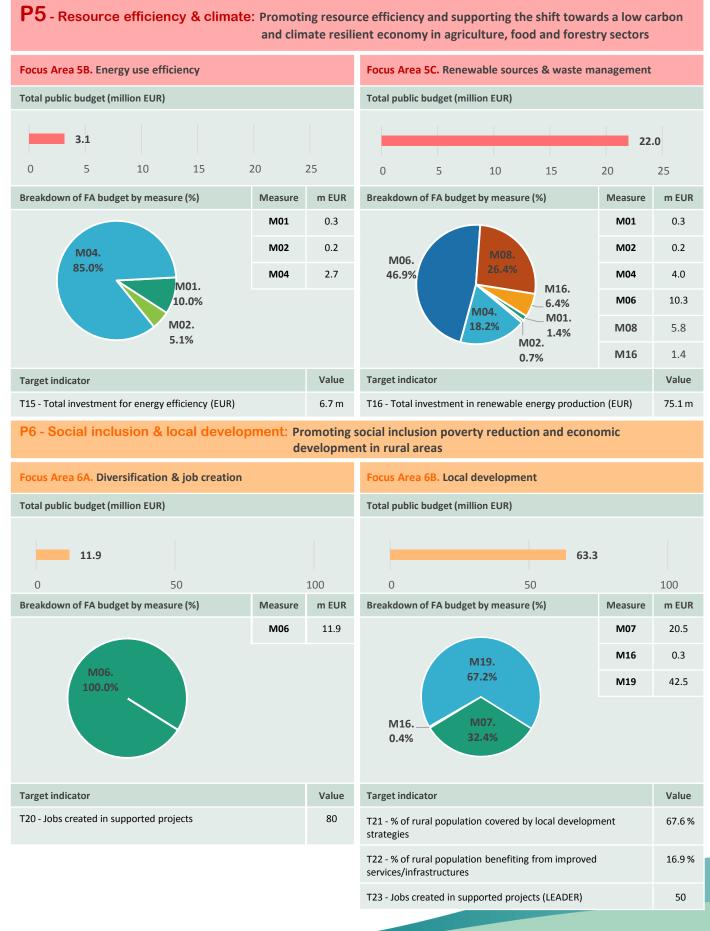

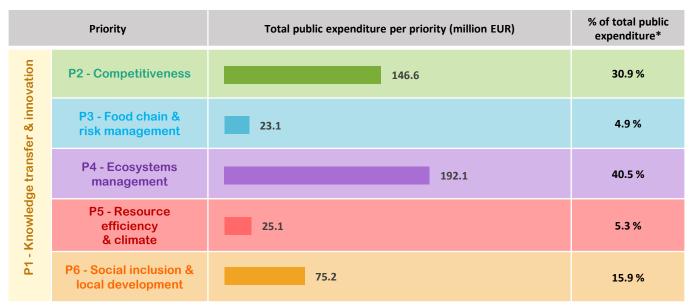

3. Planned expenditure per priority

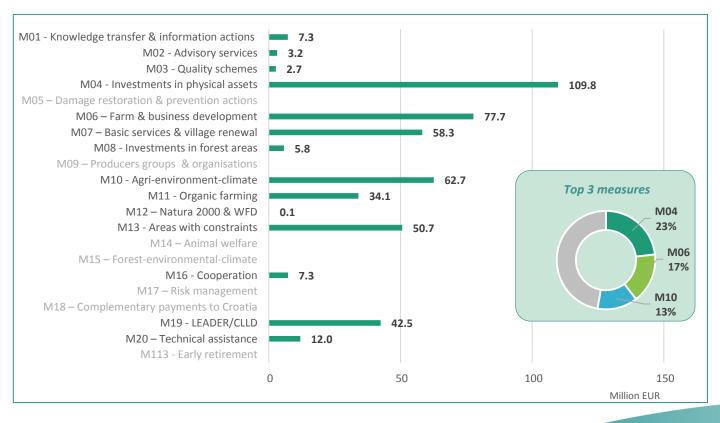

Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
