

#### **Examples of expected achievements**

- To promote the knowledge transfer, the RDP will support training activities for 4 800 participants. The programme will also support 25 cooperation projects in various fields including at least 2 within the framework of the European Innovation Partnership (EIP) on Agricultural Productivity and Sustainability.
- · Modernisation and development projects will be financed in 1 700 agricultural holdings (7 % of the total number of holdings).
- The RDP will help mobilize more than EUR 28 million during the programming period to promote processing and marketing activities in farms (e.g. direct sales) and agro-food businesses.
- The programme will support the conversion or maintenance of organic farming on 27 000 ha (1.8 % of the UAA), while agrienvironment-climate measures will cover 198 000 ha (12 % of UAA). In total, 12 % of the UAA will be under management contracts to maintain biodiversity and landscapes, 11 % for water management, and 4.3 % for the soil management and erosion prevention.
- Concerning renewable energy, 30 projects will be financed by the programme to promote investments on methane production and valorisation
- About 15 Local Development Strategies (LDS) implemented by Local Action Groups (LAGs) covering 60 % of the rural population.

#### **Examples of key challenges**

- The economy of the region is characterized by the disappearance of services in rural areas.
- Traditional SMEs encounter difficulties find enough young workers in rural areas.
- · In addition 15% of the population lives below the poverty threshold and over 25% of young people are unemployed.
- The competitiveness of farms remains an important regional issue as it affects the economic dynamism of the region which generates the region's productive activities.
- Water management is also a major issue as water bodies are degrading due to chemical pollution including of agricultural origin.













#### 3. Planned expenditure per priority


