

Examples of expected achievements

- The RDP will promote lifelong learning by providing training for 1 200 participants from the agricultural, food and forestry sectors.
- The programme will finance 48 cooperation projects including 4 operational groups within the European Innovation Partnership (EIP) "Agricultural Productivity and Sustainability".
- It is also aimed to support 787 farms (28 % of the total) on implementing modernisation and development projects.
- The RDP will contribute to generational renewal through 250 young farmers' projects throughout the programming period.
- The programme aims to engage 360 new participants in quality schemes and will support 40 investment projects in the food sector.
- About 8 % of the agricultural area will be under agri-environment-climate contracts or will receive support to maintain or convert to organic farming.
- · About 68 thousand ha of agricultural land will receive payments for areas with natural or other constraints.
- In addition, about EUR 1 million will be allocated to improve irrigation systems on 40 ha of irrigated area (0.33% of the total irrigated area).
- The RDP will support Local Development Strategies (LDS) that will be implemented by 6 LEADER Local Action Groups covering 54 %
 of the rural population.

Examples of key challenges

- Corsica is an island in the Mediterranean Sea better known as "mountain in the sea". It has a steep mountainous terrain, with less than 10 % of the territory having slope less than 12 %.
- · Corsica is also one of the poorest regions French with one in five people living below the poverty line in 2010.
- The economic size of farms is only 2/3 of the French average size.
- The island is affected by specific handicaps to islands, such as high transportation costs for both supplies and shipments.
- Almost 100 % of the island's agricultural area is classified as area facing natural or other specific constraints.











3. Planned expenditure per priority



Priority 1 is considered to be cross-cutting and no separate financial allocation is shown as the expenditure is distributed across other focus areas. Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
