

### **Examples of expected achievements**

- The programme will support 54 cooperation projects including 4 operational groups within the European Innovation Partnership (EIP) on "Agricultural Productivity and Sustainability".
- Training will be provided for about 500 participants from the agricultural and forestry sectors.
- The RDP for Guadeloupe intends to support generational renewal with a target of 100 projects of young farmers to be supported throughout the programming period.
- Around 45 farms will benefit from aid to participate in quality systems and innovative approaches including marketing methods (promotion of short chains and local markets).
- About 9 % of the agricultural area will be covered by agri-environment-climate contracts and 100 projects for non-productive investments will be linked to the achievement of agri-environmental objectives.
- About 1 200 beneficiaries will be trained / advised on improving the energy efficiency of farms and primary sector food processing businesses.
- Around 50 jobs will be created through the implementation of Local Development Strategies (LDS).

#### **Examples of key challenges**

- Guadeloupe is an island of the archipelago of the Lesser Antilles and an outermost region of the European Union, as well as an overseas department of France.
- Guadeloupe has remarkable biodiversity that is recognized worldwide.
- Soil degradation is experienced due to increased erosion by the tropical environment, inappropriate agricultural practices and intensive farming.
- There is also soil pollution by chlordecone that is a pesticide used until 1993 for the cultivation of bananas.
- Water pollution is a concern arising from the use of fertilizers, pesticides and industrial and domestic waste.
- Guadeloupe is highly exposed to climate phenomena such as floods, earthquakes and volcanic activity.


