

### **Examples of expected achievements**

- Support for investments will be provided to farms in sectors in difficulty (including breeding and specialised agriculture) to improve the farms environmental and economic competitiveness. About 900 holdings (18 % of the total) will be covered.
- The programme will support the generational renewal targeting 330 projects for the installation of young farmers throughout the programming period.
- Approximately 4 % of the agricultural area will be covered by agri-climate-environment contracts to preserve biodiversity and landscapes. Agri-environment measures to improve the quality of water will cover 5.5 % of the agricultural area, while those aimed at better management of agricultural soils will cover 5.5 %.
- In addition, 200 non-productive investment projects will be linked to the achievement of agri-environmental objectives.
- Support for converting (4 500 ha) and maintaining organic farming (7 000 ha) will cover 2 % of the agricultural land.
- About 3 million EUR of public and private investments will be devoted to renewable energy.
- The programme will support five Local Development Strategies (LDS) covering about 16 % of the rural population.

#### **Examples of key challenges**

- The region is marked by strong urbanization and the necessity to preserve and better structure rural and forest areas.
- The agricultural activity in the region faces numerous development constraints including pressure on land and urban sprawl. These factors generate high cost of access to land making it difficult for young farmers to set up.
- Farms (dairy and suckler) are isolated and cattle and sheep herds are constantly decreasing. The sector is also characterized by the low number and precariousness of regional slaughterhouses.
- · Forest resources suffer from low timber prices and strong human pressure because of over 100 million visits per year.
- The region faces an increasing fragmentation of natural areas related to urbanization and transport infrastructure resulting in a loss of biodiversity and genetic resources.
- Other major challenges are the chronic water deficit which is expected to increase due to climate change, health risks due to water
  pollution from pesticides and nitrates, and increasing soil sealing.








