#### **Examples of expected achievements**

- To promote knowledge transfer the RDP will support training activities for 1 675 participants and 170 cooperation projects including 20 projects under the European Innovation Partnership (EIP) on "Agricultural Productivity and Sustainability".
- In response to farm investment needs the programme will support modernization and development projects in 2 500 farms, which is more than 8 % of the total number of farms.
- Support for young farmers will be available aiming to reach nearly 1 300 farms managed by young farmers (about 4 % of the total).
- The programme will finance 170 investment projects to improve the competitiveness of agribusinesses.
- The RDP support will also allow the conversion to or the maintenance of organic farming on 53 500 ha (6 % of the UAA).
- Agri-environment-climate measures will cover 65 000 ha (7 % of UAA). In total, the RDP will aim 10 % of the UAA being under management contracts for preserving the biodiversity and landscapes, 8 % under management contracts for water management, and 8 % for soil management and erosion prevention.
- The program will support 120 projects on more efficient irrigation systems covering an area of 16 000 ha of irrigated land which is more than 26 % of the total irrigated area.
- Concerning local development, 14 Local Development Strategies (LDS) will be implemented by Local Action Groups (LAGs).

#### **Examples of key challenges**

- The area is mainly covered by extensive farming which is particularly vulnerable to natural stresses and climatic hazards.
- Like in most French regions the agricultural population is ageing and there are difficulties in farms' succession.
- In total, two thirds of the region's UAA is classified as disadvantaged area. Mountain and high mountain areas account for over 77 % of the region's area (or 51% of the total UAA).
- Water management is a major issue for the region. There is water deficit and also degradation due to chemical pollution from various origins.
- The region is characterized by low population density and the difficulty to maintain the infrastructure, networks and efficient services needed to address the population's needs.





Breakdown of FA budget by measure (%)



## 3. Planned expenditure per priority


