

Examples of expected achievements

- The RDP will support the implementation of 120 cooperation projects including 20 operational groups within the European Innovation Partnership (EIP) 'Agricultural Productivity and Sustainability'.
- The programme will finance training for 5 000 participants from the agricultural, food and forestry sectors as well as for small rural businesses and demonstration or information actions.
- Support will be granted to 2 100 modernization and development projects.
- Similarly, the RDP plans to strengthen generational renewal in agriculture through 1 200 installation projects of young farmers.
- For the effective and sustainable management of forests 500 operations on infrastructure and equipment will be supported.
- More than 220 operations on processing (on farm and food industries) and marketing of agricultural products will be financed.
- About 140 000 ha will benefit from payments for areas with natural constraints.
- The programme will support the conversion and maintenance of organic farming on 50 500 ha.
- The population that will benefit from improved services and infrastructure in rural areas amounts to about 1.5 million inhabitants (67 % of total).

Examples of key challenges

- The region is at the centre of area which includes 90 million consumers within a radius of 300 km.
- Timber industry is an essential component of the region's economy.
- The region is rich in wetlands that cover 200 000 ha. These are home to many endangered and protected plant and animal species. However, half of the wetlands have disappeared in the past fifty years.
- The Natura 2000 network covers 7 % of the regional area and mainly consists of forests.







3. Planned expenditure per priority



Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
