

Examples of expected achievements

- The RDP will support the implementation of 24 cooperation projects that will focus on different themes such as agriculture or food and local strategies for forest development.
- To promote knowledge transfer the programme will provide training for 4 500 people working in the agricultural and food sectors.
- The RDP also aims to encourage the installation of young farmers with the goal of reaching 910 farms managed by farmers under 40 years old (or 7 % of all farms in 2010).
- The program will support modernization and development projects in 2 200 farms (16 % of the total number of farms in 2010) to improve their economic, social and environmental performance.
- The RDP will spend EUR 15 million to support 400 farms on quality systems as well as 160 farms and food industries.
- The programme will promote the development of more environmental friendly agricultural practices targeting about 100 000 ha (12 % of the total agricultural area) thus contributing to the preservation of biodiversity, water and soil.
- The programme will support the establishment of nine LEADER Local Action Groups (LAGs) whose Local Development Strategies (LDS) will benefit 1 million people in rural areas.

Examples of key challenges

- The region has developed food industries at national and European scale.
- Rural areas are declining as a result of the expansion of urban centers, however they have potential to host residents and
 recreational activities making them potential levers for local development.





3. Planned expenditure per priority


