

Examples of expected achievements

- The RDP will aim to provide training for 2 000 participants from the agricultural, food and forestry sectors in order to promote lifelong learning.
- The programme will support around 2 000 farms (9 % of the total) through modernization projects and the development of 420 small farms. Similarly, the programme will support 1 350 young farmers throughout the programming period.
- About 33 % of the agricultural area will be under agri-environment-climate contracts.
- The programme will support the conversion (27 000 ha) and maintenance of organic farming with the goal of reaching 30 % of the agricultural area used for organic farming by 2020.
- It is expected that 4 000 ha (4.1 % of irrigated areas) will be supported to benefit from more efficient irrigation systems.
- The programme aims to support 13 Local Development Strategies (LDS) that will benefit about 43 % of the population and will generate 270 jobs.

Examples of key challenges

- The region has 113 Natura 2000 sites which cover 31 % of the region's area. This highlights the critical role of cultivated agricultural land, pastures and forests in preserving biodiversity.
- The average farm income in the region is relatively low. Fruit and vegetable sectors are in a difficult economic situation due to repeated crises in the recent years.
- Agriculture in the region is constrained by the peri-urban areas and more than half of the farms are located in urban centers or near them.
- Besides these areas of high land pressure, the region is also characterized by a very large proportion of UAA in areas with natural constraints (63.5 %), mainly in mountain areas.
- About 38 % of the population resides in rural and predominantly rural areas which are in deficit of services to the population (health, culture, leisure), etc.








Total public budget (million EUR)












3. Planned expenditure per priority



Priority 1 is considered to be cross-cutting and no separate financial allocation is shown as the expenditure is distributed across other focus areas. Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
