

Examples of expected achievements

- The RDP will support the establishment of 11 cooperation projects in various fields.
- To promote knowledge transfer, the programme will provide training for about 10 000 people on the agricultural, food and forestry sectors.
- The programme will support the modernization and development of 1 800 farms (13 % of the total).
- Generational renewal will also be promoted by financing the installation of 800 young farmers (6 % of total farms) throughout the programming period.
- Agro-environment-climate measures will target about 70 000 ha that will be managed under contracts (5.2 % of total agricultural area) to help address the challenges of preserving biodiversity, water and soil.
- About 200 investment projects will be supported to promote the production and use of renewable energy, particularly through the use of locally produced wood.
- The programme will support 7 Local Development Strategies (LDS) that will be implemented by Local Action Groups (LAGs), and will benefit 21 % of the region's population.

Examples of key challenges

- Overall, the agribusiness sector of Picardie adds value to 2/3 of the local agricultural production.
- The socio-economic challenges in agriculture in the region are related, essentially, to large crops due to prices fluctuations, the competition parameters in the global markets as well as basic inputs.
- The challenges related to the environment are particularly related to the increasing pressure on land due to growing suburbanization around urban centres, and threats on the rich but fragile natural heritage of the region in terms of biodiversity, soil and water quality.


P1 - Knowledge transfer & innovation: Fostering knowledge transfer and innovation in agriculture, forestry, and rural areas









3. Planned expenditure per priority



The following chart shows which priorities and focus areas are selected in the RDP and the combination of measures used to address them. For each measure the budget breakdown per focus area is given. Priority 1 is considered to be cross-cutting and no separate financial allocation is shown as the expenditure is distributed across other focus areas. Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
