

Examples of expected achievements

- To promote lifelong learning the programme aims to provide training for 3 500 participants.
- The programme intends to support 24 % of farms in modernization and development projects.
- Similarly, 2 % of farms will be targeted for the installation of young farmers.
- The RDP will help mobilize about 47 million EUR during the programming period to support 50 investment projects in the food industry to improve the performance of the sector.
- Agri-environment and climate measures will cover about 9 000 ha (21 % of total agricultural area) to address the need to preserve biodiversity, water and soil.
- The RDP of Reunion will provide support to projects aimed at better water resources management while securing and developing irrigation for 1 700 ha or 20 % of the irrigated agricultural area.
- The programme will contribute to improve access to basic services, the living environment and access to employment in rural areas with the objective to cover 20 % of the rural population.

Examples of key challenges

- Reunion is an overseas region of France and it has the status of "ultra-peripheral region" (ORs) of the European Union.
- The GDP per capita is below 75 % of average GDP of the European Union, and the region is ranked among the least developed regions.
- The economy of Reunion was affected by the 2008 financial crisis and has an unemployment rate around 30 % while the poverty rate accounted for 19.3 % in 2011.
- The preservation of the region's farmland requires the protection of the current agricultural land and reclaiming wasteland.



3. Planned expenditure per priority



Expenditure under Priority 4 is programmed for the priority as a whole, not for individual focus areas.
