

#### **Examples of expected achievements**

- To promote lifelong learning, the RDP has set the goal of training 19 400 participants from the agricultural, food and forestry sectors.
- The programme will support about 3 700 farms (9.5 % of the total) in improving both their economic and environmental performance, and ensuring their long term competitiveness.
- About 1 350 farms will receive support to participate in quality systems, including organic farming, local markets and short supply chains.
- Agro-environment-climatic measures will cover 187 900 ha (17 % of total agricultural area) to help preserve the biodiversity, soil and water resources.
- In favour of improving the use of water resources through investments in more efficient irrigation infrastructure, it is expected that 8 400 hectares will benefit from more efficient irrigation systems.
- The RDP is also focusing on LEADER cooperation projects, and the goal is to support 25 Local Development Strategies (LDS) that will benefit 57 % of the rural population and will eventually generate 150 jobs.

#### **Examples of key challenges**

- Rhône-Alpes is the second largest region in France in terms of area and population.
- The region is very mountainous and about 57 % of its territory is located in mountainous areas. In total 71 % of the territory is classified as a natural handicap area.
- · Agricultural decline in the region would have a negative impact on the environment and employment particularly in mountain areas.
- The network of Natura 2000 sites covers about 11 % of the region and includes 166 sites.

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

### 3. Planned expenditure per priority


