

Examples of expected achievements

- Almost 120 different cooperation projects (inter alia developing pilot projects, and creating clusters and networks) will be financed, including support for 26 Operational Groups under the European Innovation Partnership (EIP). The region will also deliver nearly 74 000 places in training courses.
- More than 2 200 investment projects will be supported for investments in restructuring or modernisation, plus 2 100 young farmers will be granted business start-up aid for implementing their business plans.
- The region estimates that around 640 farmers will receive support to participate in quality schemes and short supply chain, of which around 85 % will be for participation in quality schemes and the remaining 15 % short supply chain.
- Nearly 10 % of the agricultural land will be under management contracts supporting biodiversity, water and soil management.
 Almost 1 600 hectares will receive support to convert to organic farming and another 6 300 ha to maintain it.
- Over 1000 projects will receive support targeting more efficient irrigations systems. 65 000 hectares of agricultural land will be under management contracts targeting reduction of Greenhouse Gas (GHG) and ammonia emissions.
- Local Action Groups (LAGs) will implement their Local Development Strategies (LDS), covering more than 1.1 million people in rural areas. Additional 138 jobs will also be created in supported projects: 98 jobs by LAGs and 40 jobs through non-agricultural activities.

Examples of key challenges

- Veneto is categorised as a "more developed" region and it has outstanding natural and cultural/historical heritage. Besides farming, the agri-food and aquaculture sectors also play an important role for agriculture in the region.
- In general, the agricultural sector faces structural changes as economic dimensions of agricultural and forestry holdings are lower than the European average.. Ageing of agricultural population and low proportion of young farmers in the agricultural workforce are also issues of concern.
- Veneto also faces environmental challenges, such as an increased and serious pressure on land use. Soil erosion is lower that the
 ltalian average, but it is an issue for mountain and some hill areas. Organic farming is still underdeveloped and covers only 2.1 % of
 the total farmland (5 % Italian average), despite the good potential in this sector.













3. Planned expenditure per priority


