

- Considerations "Determined to strengthen the integration of local initiatives and rural capacity in mainstream EU policy making, in particular through bottom-up up approaches to local development such as LEADER and CLLD"•
- P8 Governance "Building on the success of LEADER and the European Innovation Partership for Agriculture, bottom up and locally led initiatives should be rolled out to mobilise rural potentials" (P8 Governance)







Opportunities for LEADER



- P.1. Prosperity. "Rural and agricultural policies should build on the identity and dynamism of rural areas through the implementation of integrated strategies and multisectoral approaches
- P2 Value Chains. "Union policies should focus on integrated approaches to developing rural value chains and local productive networks"
- **P.3 Vitality** "Provide for self-sustaining initiatives that foster a diversified agriculture and rural economy" (digital divide, youth, quality of life, urban-rural linkages)







Opportunities for LEADER



- **P.4. Environment**. Preserve the rural environment to benefit local economic development, ecotourism, healthy living, and branding as well as the promotion of the countryside for recreation.
- **P6. Climate**: Sustainable renewable energy, , biomaterials, circular econonmy
- **P.7 Innovation**: Stronger focus on social innovation, learning, education, advice and vocational training
- **P.9 Simplification**. Restore and build the trust of stakeholders, simplify implementation, proportionality
