Why is self assessment important?

Requirement now: CPR Art 33, 34, 35 & RDR Art 54

For the future: Focusing on LEADER achievement?
Informing results based approach

Rust participant perspectives:

Does the **LEADER process deliver?** 93% Yes

Extent the LEADER process achieves / delivers something extra? Moderately 50% Significantly 37%

Importance of **proving LEADER achieves something extra**? Moderately 15% **Significantly 78%**


