

Examples of expected achievements

* European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD)

- In Madeira promoting the competitiveness of the agricultural and agro-industry sector will be achieved through farm investments that will aim at restructuring 1 000 agricultural holdings (7.5 % of the total number), while innovation will be facilitated through the support of 5 European Innovation Partnership (EIP) operational groups.
- Through RDP support 2 000 farmers will receive training, while the generational renewal of Madeira's farming will target aid to around 60 young farmers.
- About 80 holdings will participate in quality schemes, as well as in the promotion of local markets, short supply chains and producer groups.
- Around 18 % of the agricultural area will be under contract, supporting biodiversity and natural landscapes, 30 % under contract for water management and 30 % for soil management.
- In addition 1 200 ha of agricultural and forest land will be under management contracts to foster carbon sequestration or conservation.
- The entire rural population will be covered by a Local Development Strategy and it is expected that this will create at least 100
 additional jobs.

Examples of key challenges

- In Madeira most farms are situated in areas with average slopes between 16 % and 25 %, leading to high production costs as well as the intensive use of labour. The whole region is therefore considered a natural constraint area.
- Madeira has a lot of small farmers with 93 % of farms having less than 1 ha and, on average, each holding consisting of around 4 plots. Only 0.4 % of the holdings have an annual turnover higher than EUR 100 000.
- Consequently, the key challenges are to improve the competitiveness and viability of the farm sector whilst supporting traditional and environmentally sustainable agricultural systems and landscape.





3. Planned expenditure per priority


