

1971 Arnaldo Caprai purchases 112 acres in Montefalco / 1988 Arnaldo's son Marco Caprai takes over the estate, revolutionizing the production of Sagrantino di Montefalco / 1989 Starts collaboration with University of Milan / 1993 First harvest of the Montefalco Sagrantino 25 Anni / 2001 The Estate enhanced to 360 acres to start a new phase / 2006 San Francisco Wine Competition Double Golden Medal / 2008 The New Green Revolution Sustainability project starts / 2012 Arnaldo Caprai is "*Winery Of The Year*" / 2015 Arnaldo Caprai ambassador to the Milan EXPO / 2020 Agroclim technology innovation project starts

SAGRANTINO INNOVATION & TRADITION

- Sagrantino is a red grape variety typical of the Montefalco countryside
- \checkmark The cultivation has over 500 years old
- The Sagrantino wine has the highest polyphenol content in the world
- ✓ In 1970 Sagrantino was grown in just 10 hectares of vineyards
- ✓ In 2000 Sagrantino is grown in over 1,000 hectares of vineyards
- Sagrantino is currently exported to over 50 countries around the world

1. WHAT WAS YOUR BIGGEST CHALLENGE AND WHAT WAS YOUR BIGGEST ACHIEVEMENT IN THE PAST YEAR?

• The first challenge was to put the company on the safe side for what regards the economic point of view ; the second is that we succeeded without compromising the agricultural year in terms of quality.



2. HOW DO YOU SEE YOUR FARM IN 2040 AND WHAT DO YOU THINK IS NEEDED TO KEEP AGRICULTURE AS A VIABLE SECTOR IN RURAL AREAS?

We see our company as a company that must grow. We believe that a farm must be sustainable.
It has multiple roles and responsibilities towards the community. To make agriculture vital, it is necessary to be connected, reachable and not to lose competitiveness in the more developed areas.



3. IF IT WERE TO THINK OF THREE REASONS WHY AGRICULTURE IS ESSENTIAL FOR THE FUTURE OF RURAL AREAS, WHAT WOULD THESE BE?

I would like to say that without agriculture there would be no rural areas. Agriculture is essential for:

- hydrogeological maintenance
- preserves biodiversity
- active role in carbon sequestration.

I mean that agricolture produces carbon dioxide but at the same time produces oxygen. A clear example... the vines capture carbon dioxide from the atmosphere and the same vines release oxygen. This is a virtuous cycle which benefits the land and the community. It's all about sustainability!
