

Energy Policy: Our objectives






2050: Reduction of greenhouse gas emissions 80-95%

Empowering consumers

As a regulatory principle to empower consumers

Mobilising private capital, e.g. self-consumption might drive
 50% of rooftop solar deployment

Increase local acceptance of RES projects



Consumer empowerment



Empowering citizens

- Active consumers, also in multifamily houses, to be allowed to generate, store, sell and consume their own electricity
- Businesses allowed to engage in selfconsumption
- Remuneration for electricity fed in to the grid
- Charges to be cost-reflective

- Recognise energy communities
- Alleviate unnecessary administrative burden,
 e.g. for market access
- Enable access to support schemes
