


Facts:

- 43 pupils in the village school
- 20 associations and organisations operate in the village

- Vuolenkoski is located 135 kilometres from Helsinki (the capital of Finland) and the nearest city, Lahti, is 34 kilometres from the village
 - Many people commute to work to towns nearby

Villagers start to work determinatedly for the common good




Common success creates great well-being and faith to do more
