

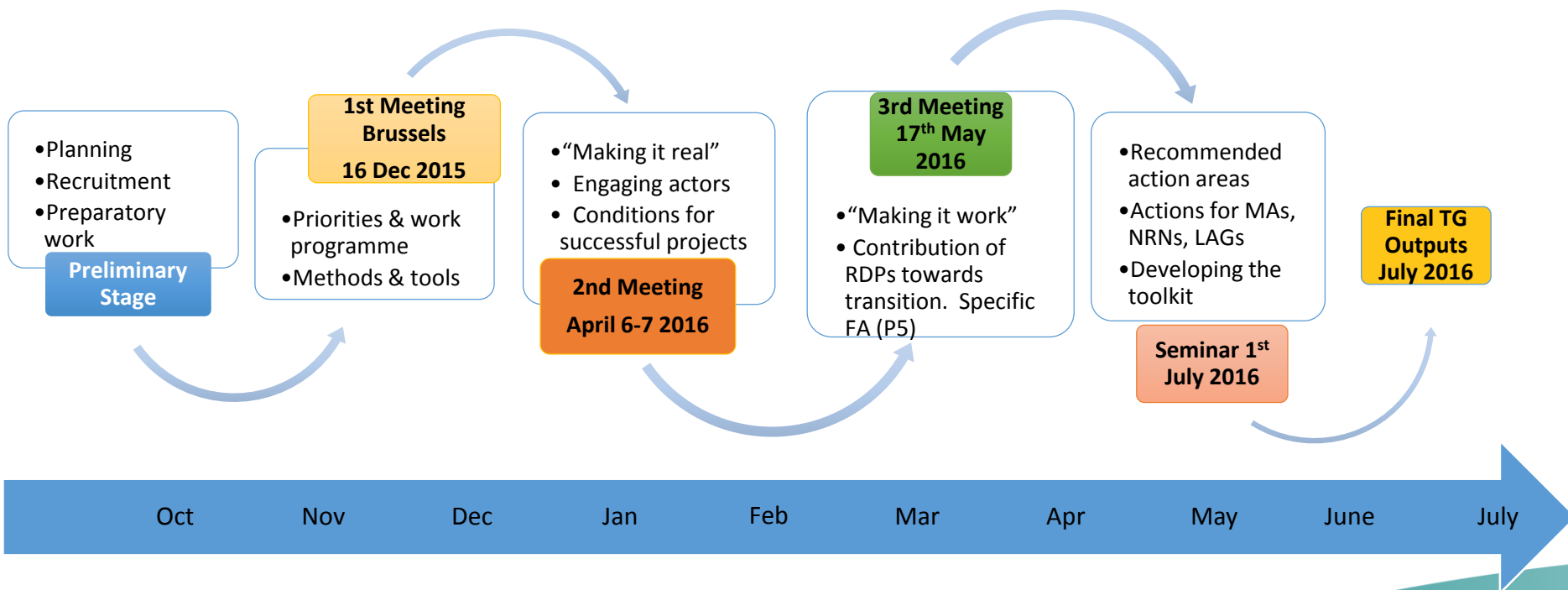

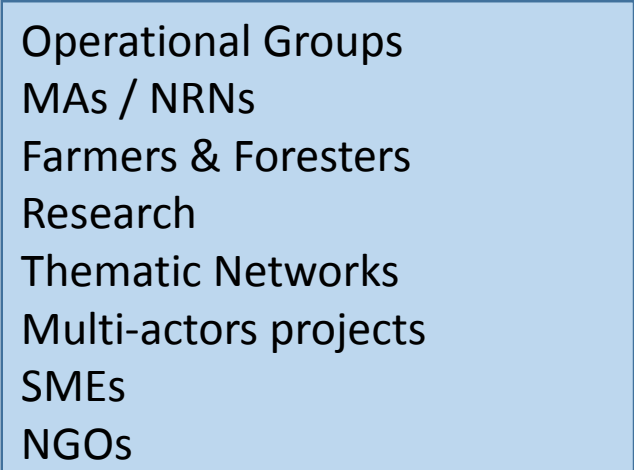

Workflow – Promoting the Transition to a Green Economy

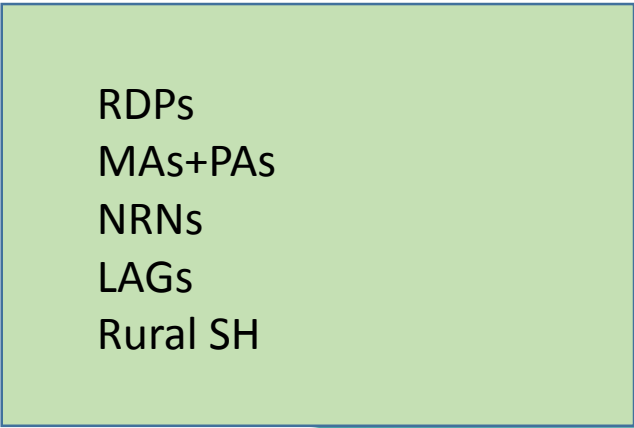
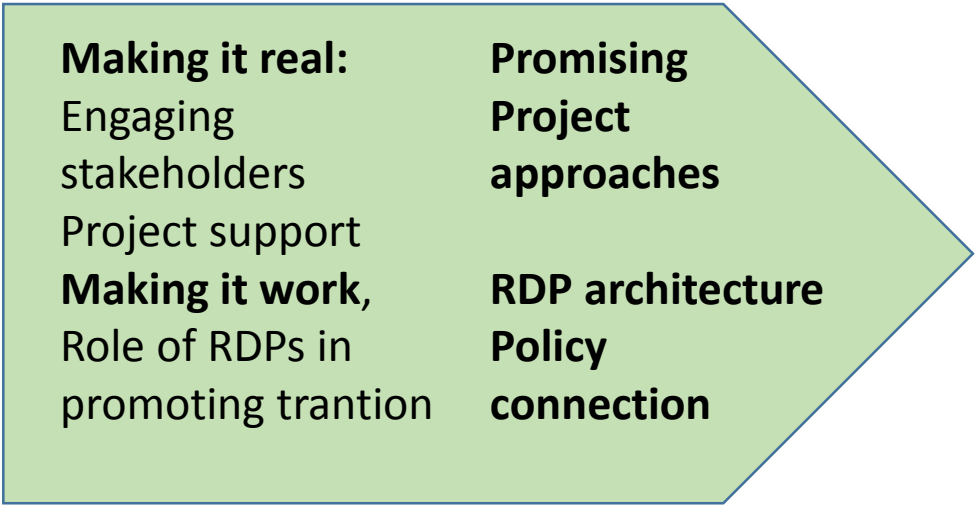


Network coordination around the green economy
