- In autumn 2014 six regional meetings were organized 300 participants. They focused on how to create real functional territories with regards both to the administrative capacity, the competence in LAG and the function of the different funds chosen for the strategy.
- Spring 2015, three regional leader meetings have been held

- Autumn 2015 the national leader conference will be organised with a leader area as host
