Objectives of the meeting

The overall aim of the 1st Rural Networks' Assembly meeting is to successfully launch the Rural Networks' Assembly as the main governance body of the ENRD and EIP-AGRI networks and as an effective forum for debating the strategic framework for their activities. The objectives of the meeting are:

1st Rural Networks' Assembly - Parallel workshops

Workshop 1: “Better Networking with ENRD/EIP-AGRI” - *How rural policy networks complement other forms of networking to increase participation*

Aim: identify specific activities the Networks should prioritise to ensure more effective participation. This will be looked at from the perspective of competitive agriculture, the sustainable management of natural resources and balanced territorial development.

Questions: What are stakeholder needs?
What channels and methods for more effective participation?
What are the areas for common action?

Workshop 2: “Farmers in Innovation” – *How to establish a dialogue between farmers and research community*

Aim: identify the best ways to ensure farmers become more involved in EU Networks (EIP-AGRI and ENRD). Explore the benefits for farmers and how actors in both networks (NRNs, advisers, advisory organisations etc.) can support this.

Questions: What could be effective communication channels for the EU Networks?
What should be main messages (terminology, aspects etc.) to address?
How can stakeholders in EU Networks contribute to this?

Workshops 3 & 4: “Networking priorities” - *What are the priority themes for improving RDP implementation that the Networks should address*

Aim: identify priority themes the EU Networks should address. Challenges, and hence themes may be: sectoral (e.g. value chain, results-orientated AEC activities) or horizontal (e.g. access to finance, improving ‘delivery’ performance, end user simplification).

Questions: What are the most important challenges/themes?
How important can networking be to address any given theme or challenge?

Workshop 5: “What should come first in innovation” - *What are the priority innovation themes that the Networks should address?*

Aim: identify priorities for innovation themes that the EU rural networks should address.

Questions: What are possible innovation themes?
What are the priority innovation themes?
How can the EU networks contribute to addressing such themes?

Workshop 6: “Better communication with stakeholders” - *How can the Networks communication activities complement existing awareness raising activities*

Aim: identify communications activities the Networks should prioritise to ensure mutual benefit with other stakeholders’ activities.

Questions: What are the priority rural development communication goals?
Which activities should be prioritised by EU Rural Networks taking note of other institutions’ existing activities and opportunities for synergy?
